We provide opportunities to develop and practise new skills and strategies in a range of sports. e.g. athletics, cricket, dance, football, hockey, netball, rounders, tag rugby, swimming and tennis. These are offered both during normal school hours and in after school clubs.

We participate in tournaments organised by recognised sports national governing bodies. In order to develop specific interests, pupils are encouraged to join local clubs with whom we maintain strong links.

We make full use of the Meridian Leisure Centre and The Pavilion in Louth, both brand new state of the art facilities recognised regionally and nationally for their quality.

The Arts

We have a strong tradition in art and produce high standards in a variety of media. This is appropriately linked with the study of art history.

Alongside class music lessons or small practice groups, we offer individual tuition in singing and piano. The school choir significantly enhances Harvest Festival, Christmas carol services and the annual school concert.

There are links with Louth Playgoers Riverhead Theatre, an Arts Council funded project which provides a fitting venue for Greenwich House to stage its outstanding productions each summer term.

Our pupils regularly participate in local arts festivals.

Pupils achieve successes in public examinations in singing, piano and speaking.

The School Kitchen

Pupils are offered cooked lunches prepared in our own kitchen.
